Earlier this year the city of Pleasant Valley enacted a public alert system in order to keep our residents safe. In the event of an emergency event, we will send out the necessary information to keep you informed and aware. The system is also linked to the National Weather Service and will send out automated weather alerts. As many of you are aware, multiple alerts were sent for the severe thunderstorm warnings on the morning of April 18^{th.} . The multiple alerts were redundant and maddening and I apologize. Changes have been made to ensure this does not happen again. A quiet period from 9pm-8am has been put in place. No weather alerts will occur during that time, with the exception of a tornado warning. A "Tornado Warning" is a tornado confirmed by radar or weather spotter and it is important that you seek shelter when this occurs.

You do have the ability to opt out if you choose to. My hope is that you will not. The goal of public alert system is to keep the citizens of Pleasant Valley informed and safe. 

Greetings from Public Works,

As summertime approaches interior and exterior remodeling projects increase. Please be sure that you and/or your contractor are obtaining the proper permits for these projects and that your contractor has a business license to do business in Pleasant Valley. Projects started without a permit are subject to double the permit fee.

Spring and summer are also a good time for water quality awareness. Please be sure that you are keeping your grass clippings off of the street and out of the storm drains and culverts. Use your fallen leaves as mulch and do not rake them into your culvert or storm drain. Prevent soil erosion by seeding and mulching bare soil areas. Pick up your pet waste. Sweep granular fertilizers and pesticides from hard surfaces back into the lawn. Direct downspouts onto grassy areas for absorption and to reduce runoff that pollute our waterways. Consider installing a rain barrel.

Mark your calendars for "Day in the Park" Saturday May 4, 2024 from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. We will have free birdhouses and squirrel feeders. You can also learn more about protecting our natural waterways. There will be a bounce house, games and activities. Food will be provided by Firehouse subs.

We will advertise for bids on the storm water repair (dip in road) on Kaill rd on May 2nd. We will allow 30 days for contractors to bid the job. The bid opening will be Thursday May 30th. Target to award the project will be June 1st. 
CHERRY UPSIDE-DOWN CAKE

1/2 cup butter
1 1/3 cups sugar
1 tsp. vanilla
2 cups cake flour
1/4 tsp. salt
2 tsp. baking powder
2/3 cup water
3 egg whites

SAUCE

1 can pitted sour cherries (1 lb, 4 oz.) 1 cup sugar

1 tsp. red food coloring



Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Cream butter and sugar, add vanilla. Sift flour with salt and 1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder, add alternatively with the water to the butter mixture, beating well after each addition.

Beat remaining baking powder with the egg whites until stiff. Fold whites into mixture. Divide batter into two greased and floured 9" layer pans.

For sauce: Drain cherries well. Measure 3/4 cup of juice. Add water if needed to make up the difference. Combine juice, cherries, sugar and coloring. Heat to the boiling point. Pour hot cherry sauce over cake batter. Bake for 35 minutes. Cool for 3 minutes. Turn upside down Place layers using sauce as both filling and topping. Serve with whipped cream.

Public comments and guests: Janese Brown of Walnut Lane Manufactured Home Community addresses the Board of Aldermen requesting a bill credit for a water leak caused by frozen pipes. Ms. Brown assured the Board of Aldermen that all reasonable precautions (heat tape, dripping faucets, etc.) had been done by residents, but the extreme cold caused the pipe to burst. The city clerk will determine the credit request amount based on city policy and present it at the next meeting.

City Attorney and other professional services: None.

Mayor's comments: None

Aldermen Comments: Alderwoman Ohlsen discussed Ordinance 3454 approved by the board of Aldermen on June 20, 2022. She stated that it was her understanding that the Board of Aldermen approved an 8% raise for all staff effective immediately and an additional .5% effective 1/1/2023. The additional .5% was never received by staff. Alderwoman Mesimer said there was no discussion at the time about the additional .5% increase. Alderwoman Ohlsen asked City Attorney Tom Capps for his legal opinion as to whether, based on his reading of Ordinance 3454 that the additional .5% was due to staff. Attorney Capps reads the ordinance as the additional .5% increase is due to staff. Alderman Gallagher stated that the Consumer Price Index (CPI) through June of 2022 was 8.5%, but for the entire year was 8.01%. Alderman Gallagher stated that it was his opinion that the intent of the Board of Aldermen was to reevaluate any

additional increase at year end based on the full-year CPI. Court Administrator Sarah Everhart stated that her recollection was that the Board of Aldermen adopted the 8% increase in June and would add the .5% increase later. Mayor Smith stated that he would veto any across the board raises.




