

City of Pleasant Valley Missouri Special Meeting of the Board of Aldermen February 13, 2024

Call to Order: A Special meeting of the Pleasant Valley Board of Aldermen was called to order at City Hall, 6500 Royal Street, Pleasant Valley, Missouri, by Mayor James Smith, on Tuesday, February 13, 2024, at 6:32 p.m. Copies of the agenda were available in the lobby for public inspection prior to the meeting.

Roll Call:

Closed Session: Alderman Scarborough moved to enter closed session, authorized by 610.021, subsection 1 (Legal actions). Alderwoman Jacoby seconded the motion. The vote was as follows: Mesimer – aye, Moss – aye, Scarborough – aye, Gallagher – aye, Page – aye, Langner – aye, Ohlsen – absent, and Jacoby - aye. Motion passed 7 ayes, 0 nays, 1 absent. 6:34 pm.

During the closed session, no vote was taken, nor motions made.

Alderman Scarborough moved to return to open session at 6:47 pm. Alderwoman Jacoby seconded the motion. The vote was as follows: Jacoby – aye, Mesimer – aye, Moss – aye, Scarborough – aye, Gallagher – aye, Page – aye and Ohlsen – absent. Motion passed 7 ayes, 0 nays, 1 absent.

Police Chief Jared McGinley addressed the Board of Aldermen about purchasing a Dodge Durango that is being held by the dealership for the Police Department. Chief McGinley stated that he has spoken with multiple local agencies that are using Dodge vehicles including the Missouri Highway Patrol and police departments in Gladstone, Kearney, and Liberty. Chief McGinley requested approval to purchase the Dodge Durango tomorrow and stated that the cost saving compared to the Ford would be \$9,200. Chief McGinley stated that the price to outfit the Dodge as a police vehicle would be the same as the price to outfit the Ford. Chief McGinley stated that the Police Department had not ordered any vehicles in two years and this purchase would replace vehicle 703, the vehicle most in need of replacement. Alderman Page asked if the dealership had more of the vehicles available. Chief McGinley stated that yes, they did, but they were going fast.

Alderman Gallagher moved to approve the purchase by the Police Department of a Dodge Durango as requested by Police Chief Jared McGinley. There was no second to the motion and no vote was taken.

Alderwoman Mesimer stated that there would be a budget meeting on Friday, February 23rd and finances would be discussed then.

Adjournment: There being no further business, Alderwoman Mesimer moved to adjourn. Alderman Scarborough seconded the motion. The vote was as follows: Jacoby – aye, Mesimer – aye, Moss –



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aye, Gallagher – aye, Ohlsen – absent, Scarborough – aye, Page – aye and Langner - aye. Motion passed 7 ayes, 1 absent, 0 nays.
